The Faculty was active in preparing Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP) and summer schools. One BIP within the Erasmus+ programme was organized at our Faculty and one in cooperation with Poznań University of Life Sciences, Poland. In cooperation with the University of Padua, a summer school for FLD students took place in Italy. Despite intensive support and motivation for students and staff, individual mobility has not important mainly in terms of an increased research staff.

The Faculty's priority has been increasing scientific publications in the Nature Index practice. I am pleased to say that in 2024,

passed due to the implementation of Faculty support programmes for excellent science, the motivation of staff and PhD students, quality application outputs, popularization of science, and the transfer of scientific results into teaching. The quality of outputs is evidenced by the low proportion (9%) of publications in the third and fourth quartiles. There was also a significant increase in the share of publications where the first author is from our Faculty, the Faculty has more than half the number of authors in the team of authors, as well as the number of publications created in cooperation with a foreign institution.

Project activity in 2024 was also positive; a total of 61 research and educational projects were implemented at the Faculty, of which 21 were international. A major success is the new HIVE project, which was awarded to the Faculty under the ERA Chairs call of the Horizon Europe programme; for FLD, the HIVE project represents a significant achievement.

The Faculty was also active in its social life and continued the tradition of organizing FLD Family Day, the Christmas concert, and publishing the Faculty newsletter. We organized or co-organized a number of events where we promoted our studies, science, research, and other Faculty activities. In 2024, we participated in the organization and co--organization of international scientific meetings and conferences.

In an effort to help promote the local use of wood and to provide learning and community spaces for our Faculty's students, preparation for the construction of a wood building called Lesovna (the Forest House) was initiated in 2024.



3 Educational activities

Educational activities are one of the main priorities of the Faculty of Forestry and Wood Sciences. Long-term emphasis is placed on modernization of the study environment, the link to cooperation with practice, and practical training in the field. Teaching is regularly supplemented with lectures by experts from both the Czech Republic and abroad; students can thus not only learn from renowned scientists at the Faculty, but also from experts from various walks of life.

Admission exams at FLD took place at the beginning of June 2024 according to plan. Each study programme has a set criteria for selecting students. Foreigners applying for Czech-taught study programmes must have an extra interview in Czech, and applicants for English-taught study programmes must have an extra interview in English. Interviews for English study programmes could be conducted online.

A total of 1,994 applications were submitted in the two application stages, with the predominance of interest in forestry study programmes. 24% were applications from abroad. 37% of applications were submitted by women, 63% by men. Based on the admission conditions, 1833 students were accepted for study, of which 863 were subsequently enrolled in the study, which was the Faculty's aim.

Number of male and female students for bachelor's and master's studies in 2024

Female students make up 35% of the total number of students at the Faculty. The share is similar for both full-time and part-time forms of study. The highest share of female students in the total number has long been recorded for the study programme Conservation of Natural Objects and Taxidermy (74%). The number of female students is also higher in the Game Management and Wildlife Conservation programme (42%). The lowest number of female students is recorded in the Wood Technology study programme (13%).



As of 31 October 2024, a total of 1,662 students were studying at FLD, of which 1,352 were in bachelor's and 310 in master's degree fields of study and programmes. The state final exams took place at the turn of May and June. A total of 258 students successfully completed their studies, of which 162 were in bachelor's and 96 in master's degree programmes.

The success rate at the final state exam was 88.4%, with 30% of students finishing with Grade A. 12% of students finished their studies with merit. The employability of FLD graduates on the labour market has been almost 100% in the long term.




Number of students in full-time and part-time form of bachelor and master studies as of 31 October 2024

7 Faculty development

In 2024, FLD implemented a total of 61 research or educational projects with an annual budget of almost CZK 94 million, of which the largest financial share was taken by national projects financed from the programmes of grant agencies TA CR, GA CR, NAZV, MEYS, and the grant agency of the Forests of the Czech Republic (LČR) with a total annual budget of almost CZK 47 million. International projects from the Horizon Europe, Interreg, Life, and Erasmus+ programmes are becoming an increasingly important source of funding, with an annual budget of approximately CZK 34 million. Projects financed by Structural Funds came third with a budget of CZK 13 million. In terms of the number of implemented projects, the largest number was again represented by national projects (34), of which 12 were funded by the National Agency for Agricultural Research (NAZV), 6 by TA CR programmes, 6 by GA CR programmes and 10 by other national agencies, mainly by the LČR and the MEYS grant agencies. A total of 21 international projects were implemented. In addition, 6 projects were financed from ESIF programmes, especially the Jan Amos Komenský Operational Programme (JAK OP).

National projects

In 2024, the Faculty submitted 52 applications to national grant competitions, especially GA CR, TA CR and NAZV. As of the Annual Report closing date, 7 applications were successful. Among other things, the Forest Risk Research Department managed to obtain a three-year project entitled Ongoing bark beetle outbreak in the Czech Republic as a basis for adaptation of forests and the forestry sector to climate change and development of resilience to future outbreak situations from the NAZV programme. The project is implemented in cooperation with the Research Institute of Forestry and Hunting (VÚHLM) and corresponds to the research priorities of the Concept of Research, Development and Innovation of the Ministry of Agriculture for 2023-2032.

Projects from international competitions

Last year, six international projects were successfully launched: Boost4BioEast (doc. Jankovský), and TRANSFORMIT (prof. Marušák), both from Horizon Europe, RE-ENFORCE

(Dr. Korecký) from Interreg Central Europe, Fem2forests (Dr. Petra Palátová) from Interreg Danube Region, LESYpreKLÍMU (prof. Marušák) from Interreg Slovakia -Czechia and SHUNTDIEM (Dr. Kalábová) from Erasmus+. Also, the following four projects were approved for funding in 2024, with implementation starting during 2025: FORADVISE (Dr. Rinn), FORbEST (Dr. Mikolaš), HIVE (prof. Hlásny), all from Horizon Europe, and Krkonoše Forests - common management in KRNAP and KPN (Dr. Korecký) from Interreg Czechia - Poland. In particular, the new HIVE project represents a significant achievement for FLD. The main goal of the project is to bring a global leading scientist, Dr. Andrew M. Liebhold, to CZU and to create a permanent research group around him focused on biological invasions in forests. A total of 34 project applications were submitted in 2024, most of them to Horizon Europe (19), Interreg (4), or Erasmus+ (4). Structural funds

In 2024, work began on several major projects funded by the European Structural and Investment Funds. Specifically, this involves a university-wide project Improving Facilities, Equipment for Teaching, and Strategic Software at the Czech University of Life Sciences in Prague; within the project, the Faculty of Forestry and Wood Sciences has a budget of CZK 114 million until the end of 2028 for the development of infrastructure for the implementation of bachelor's, master's, and doctoral study programmes via the acquisition of new equipment or the renovation and upgrading of existing educational spaces. Another university-wide project, Enhancing the Quality and Effectiveness of the Educational Process and Strategic Management at CZU, allocates CZK 18 million to the Faculty of Forestry and Wood Sciences to improve the quality of study programmes by adapting them to current challenges, increasing the share of professionally oriented study programmes and programmes structured for blended or distance learning, and sup-

porting the internationalization of studies, internships, mobility, and similar activities. The university-wide project PhD Infra also continues, within which the Faculty has a budget of CZK 23 million until the end of 2026 for the development of infrastructure and equipment to support doctoral study programmes. In addition, last year FLD joined the project Forestry Commodities Portal and Forestry Geoportal, which focuses on the development of two web-based platforms serving to facilitate timber trade and complement this area with geospatial information; the Faculty also joined the project Supporting Green Skills and Sustainability at CZU, which aims to align teaching in study programmes and lifelong learning courses with the principles of the Green Deal. At the beginning of 2024, a project Adaptation and Innovative Solutions for Extreme Hydroclimatic Events was submitted to the Intersectoral Cooperation call (OP JAK) in collaboration with the Faculty of Environmental Sciences; however, it was not supported.

The Faculty as a whole adhered to the planned budget.





Development of subsidy for specific research and IGA in 2020–2024 in CZK



The subsidy for specific research has a long-term downward trend. The institutional subsidy for long-term conceptual development is also used to fund student research activities.


Development of revenues from contract research and ancillary activities (AA) 2020–2024 in CZK


Total AA revenues 2020-2024 in CZK




FLD staff structure

Development of the number of FLD employees 2020–2024




Development of funds for wages and employees 2020–2024




